Also, 6 students will advance to the State UIL competition and the top string ensemble earned the right to perform before a Houston Symphony concert in May!

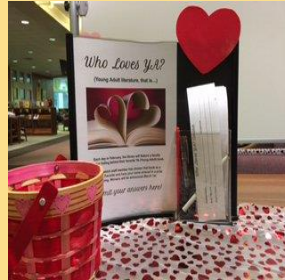
