GPA Waiver for 2017-2018

Current sophomores and juniors may apply to waive specific courses from counting in their GPA. This is recommended only for students with a cumulative GPA of 4.0 or higher. CTE Interest Forms for 2017-2018

Many of our career related courses (CTE) fill up fast, and we use the CTE Interest Form to help us reserve seats for students. To request one of these courses, you must fill out the online form: auto tech or auto collision, animation, architectural design, audio video, child guidance, construction tech, cosmetology, engineering design, Lone Star classes (for CNA/Phlebotomy, Welding, CNC, EMT), Law Enforcement, Welding. AP Testing

Students taking AP courses are expected to take the corresponding AP exams. CHS is able to supplement the costs of these exams which are usually over \$85! Students pay \$30 for each test with a maximum total of \$100. We offer discounts for those on free/reduced lunch. Final Exam Exemption Policy

**A SENIOR student may exempt any courses provided the following criteria are met:

Spring semester of 75 or greater & Average for year of 70 or greater
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must have taken a Fall final exam at CHS to exempt in the Spring• Spring Semester must be 75 or greater, and the average for both semesters for the course is passing (70)• <u>4</u> or fewer absences for the semester• Three tardies = 1 absence for exemption purposes• Present in class on the day of the final• Completed Exam Exemption Form on file
