CISD covers a large, demographically diverse region, encompassing 348 square miles. More than 63,000 students attend seven high schools, three 9th grade campuses, seven junior high schools, and numerous elementary and intermediate campuses. Conroe ISD is currently ranked as the 65th largest district in the United States and the 6th largest district in Texas.

SCHOOL DAY AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The school day consists of seven periods with each period approximately lasting 55 minutes. Students are expected to graduate on the Foundation High School Program with Endorsements. This 26 program requires:

Students must also obtain passing scores on all of the following STAAR tests: English I and II, Algebra I, Biology and US History.

MARKING SCALE AND GRADE POINTS




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

COVID-19 UPDATE

Conroe ISD provided asynchronous learning for all grades. Technology and Wifi hotspots were made available (paper packets upon request). Students produced a minimum of one graded assignment per week in each course, and teachers provided daily feedback and virtual tutorial help. Dual credit students completed all college assignments in addition meeting the high school expectations. All CISD Advanced Placement students participated in virtual supplemental reviews along with coursework to prepare for exams. In 2020-2021, students had the option of being a virtual student or attend school in person. For those students who opted to remain virtual, asynchronous and synchronous learning took place.
